President's Message

In the last several years the SDMTA Board has been investigating the possibility of splitting the conference and competition aspects of our organization. The opportunity to partner with the Dakota Sky International Piano Festival for the professional development side of our annual meeting is well worth considering. Here are some of the reasons for our thinking that this might be a positive change:

- Attendance at our fall conference averages 30-35 members. The amount of work required to put on the conference is not commensurate with the attendance.
- Changing our format or the season of our conference might motivate more of our members to attend or even attract new members. Dakota Sky is held in the summer. The fact that our members tend to have a less intense schedule in the summer may allow more of us to attend a summer event as we wouldn't have to cancel as many lessons as we do for our fall conference.
- Partnering with Dakota Sky would allow us to present more varied educational opportunities with high caliber artists and pedagogues. It might attract new members because it wouldn't be strictly for our group. Our financial support of the Festival would give them added revenue to hire the types of presenters who would interest us. In return, SDMTA members would receive a reduced rate for these workshops.
- We think of ourselves as primarily studio teachers, but increasingly studio teaching now is becoming an adjunct to a regular full-time job. Many of our music graduates teach full-time in the schools and then teach lessons on the side. They may or may not join SDMTA, but they almost certainly will join SDMEA.
- All-State Chorus and Orchestra are held the week prior to our conference. A recent development for SDMEA has been to add a slate of workshops for faculty attendees. Teachers may opt to attend SDMEA's workshops while their students participate in the chorus and orchestra, rather than join us a week later. An added incentive for them is that they can receive renewal credits for their teaching licenses through the SD Department of Education. It may be possible for us to offer teacher certification/license renewal points through the increased workshop possibilities that partnering with Dakota Sky would provide.

President's Message continued

In August Cheryl Koch and I met with the administration of Dakota Sky to discuss the possibilities. We envision the event running Thursday through Saturday the last weekend of June. The Dakota Sky Board has voted to change their dates to the end of June, enabling us to join them for the final weekend of the Festival. There would be workshops and master classes during the days and recitals in the evenings, utilizing the world-class performers and pedagogues that present at Dakota Sky. We could have up to six educational events plus 2-3 concerts. Our registration fee would remain the same, \$40 as of 2013. Nonmembers would be allowed to register but for a higher fee. The registration would allow members to attend all workshops, master classes, concerts and other events.

The MTNA/SDMTA competitions would remain as they are now, held the first weekend of November and on a rotating basis among the state universities. Payment of the \$40 registration fee for the summer conference would cover attendance at the competitions: there would be no additional fee for that.

Our conference income is generally between \$6000 and \$10,000, so we could make an "up front" contribution of \$2000 to Dakota Sky to help them with their expenses, plus at least a part of the registration fees. We would retain enough to cover our expenses. SDMTA would be included in the name of the Festival and our members would still be free to present workshops. We would also hold a general membership meeting as a no-host dinner or luncheon.

In projecting a budget for the two events, we found that we would not be spending more to hold two separate events. Utilizing the resources of Dakota Sky would provide a significant saving both financially and in the amount of work required now of our members to put on a yearly conference.

In October we will be sending out an on-line ballot to the membership to vote on the joint conference with Dakota Sky. I urge you to think over the proposed change, send your feedback or questions to me or to your local association president, and then vote on your preference. More information will be available at the conference in Brookings. Until then I wish you all a productive fall!

Professional Development Day

Another workshop will be: Dr. Symeon Waseen presenting "Dr. Strangesound or How I Learned to Stop Worrying and Love New Music." Topics will include helpful pedagogical terminology, listening habits and techniques, philosophical angles, and analytic tools. We also have Carol Flower and Theresa Stehley presenting "Tips and Tricks to Inspire Your Students." They will share many creative and useful ideas from their own piano studios. Nikita Mndoyants, our conference guest artist who was one of the six finalists of the 2013 Van Cliburn Piano Competition, will be present for a question and answer session. His recital will take place Friday evening. We will look forward to Dr. Corliss Johnson speaking at the IMTF Luncheon on the topic of "Making Real Jazz at the Piano." Christina Harbaugh Humpal is planning an Athol Conservatory Quiz Bowl (jeopardy-style), so don't forget to review your music history.

Artist Preview

The guest artist this year will be Van Cliburn Finalist and Russian composer and pianist Nikita Mndoyants. Coming from a family of professional musicians, Mndoyants began to play piano and compose music at a very young age. He entered Central



Music School in Moscow in 1995 and gave his first public recital two years later when he was eight years old. In March of 1999, the ten-year old Nikita appeared at the Sibelius Academy Concert Hall in Helsinki. His extraodinary performance there was recorded and issued on a CD in 2001.

Mndoyants graduated from the Moscow Central Music School with honors as a pianist and composer in 2006. During his studies at school, he won several national and international piano and composition competitions. In the summer of 2005 Mndoyants studied in the Tel-Hai Piano Master-classes in Israel, where he won First Prize in The Concerto competition.

In November of 2007 he won the First Prize of The VII International Paderewski Piano Competition in Poland and also special prize for the best semi-final recital. Nikita was a Finalist of 14th Van Cliburn International Competition in 2013.

(ALL members should read this as is states reasoning for obtaining your certificate.) This could be a great opportunity for your student members to earn their Professional Certificate and carry the title NCTM:

COMPETITION REPORT

This year we are returning to our older method of snail mailing applications along with the check to the respective chair. Too many checks were arriving after the deadline and that makes it challenging for the individual competition chairs. Members MUST have paid their membership dues BEFORE students send in their applications. Please adhere strictly to these deadlines. It makes it extremely difficult for everyone involved when some do not abide by the guidelines. The chairs have a lot of work to do to get schedules and program book information ready in a short amount of time and it complicates their work when some do not follow the deadlines. Please read the 2013 Handbook carefully. Both the Handbook and application form can be found on the SDMTA website. Also note that ALL application forms MUST be typed. They will be returned to the teacher if they are not.

Last year we experimented with awarding only a Performer's Certificate in SDMTA categories where there was only one contestant. Because this was not well received, we have decided to go back to our previous system or allowing the judge to decide whether or not to award a first place or not.

All of the competition chairs have remained the same for this year. Please thank these volunteers when you are in contact with them. If you have any questions, please contact your respective chair. Good luck on your student preparation—we'll see you at the competition in Brookings Nov. 7-9!

MTNA GRANTS FOR 2014

Remember applications for the Affiliate, Teacher and Program Enrichment Grants must be received by **January 3, 2014**, to be considered by the selection committees. **All applications and supporting materials must be submitted online** through the MTNA Foundation website.

<u>Program Enrichment Grants</u> are provided to organizations seeking "seed funds" to assist with the creation of grant application materials that can lead to more funding from other organizations.

Teacher Enrichment Grants are provided to music teachers for private study, specific college-level course work or other projects that will enhance the performing and teaching skills of the applicant. Teacher Enrichment Grants may be used for private study, college-level course work or special projects in performance, pedagogy, music theory and composition. The grant is not intended to be used to pursue course work toward a degree, for travel funds or for ongoing projects. However, a grant may be approved for one additional year at the discretion of the Teacher Enrichment Grant Evaluation Committee. The number of grants awarded in any year is determined by the number of qualified applicants and available funds. Local musicians to attend Music Teachers state conference

Ms. Melody Maker of Busyville, South Dakota and three of her piano students will attend the 59th annual state conference of the South Dakota Music Teachers Association, held at South Dakota State University in Brookings, November 7-9. Concerts, workshops and student competitions are the featured activities of the annual fall event. Guest presenter and adjudicator for this year's conference is Paul Wirth of the Wirth Center of the Performing Arts in St.Cloud, Minnesota. Also featured is 2013 Van Cliburn competition finalist, Nikita Mndoyants. Additional state and regional performers, clinicians and adjudicators will be featured.

The South Dakota Music Teachers Association (SDMTA) was founded in 1955 to serve the needs of studio teachers teaching music to individuals or small groups of students. The organization is an affiliate of Music Teachers National Association (MTNA), a group which now has a membership of 24,000 music professionals in fifty states and the District of Columbia. SDMTA is further supported through five local associations in Aberdeen, the Black Hills, Brookings, Huron and Sioux Falls.

Three of Ms. Maker's students will participate in the Elementary and Junior piano competitions on Saturday, November 9. Performers are Furious Fingers, age 11, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Parent Fingers, Powerful Chords, age 13, son of Ms. Solid Chords, and Gentle Soul, age 12, daughter of Ms. Good Woman and Mr. Helpful Soul. Each student will perform two memorized pieces and receive written comments from the competition adjudicators. Last year, two of Ms Maker's students placed/performed in the SDMTA state competitions.

Ms. Maker has owned and taught at Top Notch Music Studios since 1992 and is a member of the Local Area Music Teachers Association. She has a bachelor's degree in music from Best University and serves as pianist for the Busyville Community Choir. Ms. Maker completed her music teachers certification through MTNA and her state certification through SDMTA in 1994. She teaches solo and group piano lessons with additional classes in music theory, music history and music performance. Ms. Maker's students perform in the annual City Christmas concert, Top Notch Studio annual recitals and in SDMTA and Piano Teachers Guild festivals and competitions. The Top Notch Music Studios' Fall recital will be held on Sunday, December 4th at 3:00 p.m. in the Beautiful Church at 17 Autumn Lane in Busyville. The public is invited to attend.
